(Early Voting is not available for this election)

We as registered voters, are the ones who elect our Select Board, School Committee members, Town Meeting Members, the Board Members to our Park Commission, Library Trustees, Board of Assessors, and Board of Health (to name a few).

The by-laws by which our Town is governed and the issues that directly affect our homes, properties, schools, parks, roads and the safety of our town are decided upon by those we elect. The importance of voting local is tremendous.

Precincts 1 & 6- Milford Senior Center, 60 North Bow St. Precincts 2 & 3- Italian American Veterans Hall, 4 Hayward Field Precincts 4, 5, 7, 8- Milford Portuguese Club, 119 Prospect Heights

If you will be unable to make it to your polling location on Election Day between 7:00 am and 8:00 pm please apply for an **Absentee Ballot** using the following link **as soon as possible to allow sufficient time for the mailing process**:
