






MYC's MISSION

The mission of the Youth Center is to provide a safe environment that promotes self-esteem, builds character, and fosters the notion of community and the importance of respecting and serving others. By providing Milford youth with programs and a safe environment during the after school hours and during our monthly events, we address adolescent risk factors as well as promote the partnerships among community members to ensure a comprehensive vision and plan for the health of the youth in the town of Milford.







MYC's HISTORY

The Milford Armory, now home to the Milford Youth Center (MYC), was built in 1911 from Milford pink granite sourced from quarries on East Main St.

Until 2005, the Armory was home to variously designated units of the Massachusetts National Guard. At that time, the MYC occupied a couple rooms of the building but the Town recognized the need for a forever home for this much needed program, a dream of the late James F. DiAntonio.

For years, the community, the United Way of Tri-County, the Select Board and other local politicians lobbied to the state to be able to purchase the building to become the permanent home for the Youth Center, after the National Guard left. This dream became a reality in 1998 and we have been able to see it flourish ever since.

The MYC currently operates in a unique sustainable partnership with the Town of Milford and the United Way of Tri-County, who serves as the fiduciary, and has multiple other funding streams. Due to help of an Armory Renovation Committee and then Town Meeting approval, the Center went through a major, multi-million-dollar renovation in 2016 and we have been able to see even more building improvements, through donations, grants and other town and state allocations.

We are thankful to every individual, business and organizations who has been part of our MYC journey and we look forward to an even brighter future!







MYC ADMINISTRATION AND LEADERSHIP



The MYC is led by three full-time staff members; Director, Assistant Director and a Program Coordinator. In addition, the MYC has an amazing part time staff, who help oversee our after-school program, summer camp, rentals, front desk, events, marketing and YouthWorks employment program. MYC AFTER SCHOOL PROGRAM



We offer a 10-month, free after school program for Milford residents and/or students attending Milford Public Schools, ages 8-18. The program had **573** unduplicated registered

members, who were offered 2-3 structured programs a day, along with an open gym, game room and a cafe/ lounge. We offer a free snack and dinner program, due to the collaboration of CACFP, Hockomock Area YMCA, and the Milford School Food & Nutrition Services Department. This year, we served **4,733** dinners and **4,721** snacks!

March Madness



This popular, month-long event hosted 16 Teams & 83 after-school participants and an additional 3-point contest for ages 8-12 and 13-18. This

program is an amazing way for the MYC members of all

ages to work together to achieve the ultimate goal, winning the March Madness event!

MYC held 106 Recreation programs such as Fishing and Sewing!



MYC held 8 Special Events such as Escape Room, Fashion Show, MYC Thanksgiving, Friday Fright Night and we even got to see the Solar Eclipse!

MYC provided **576** Health & Fitness programs

such as Cooking, FitFun, March Madness, MYC Volleyball Tournament, Weight Room and Boxing!

MYC offered **55** special classes and workshops such as Steam, Milford TV, Social Emotional, Think Outside the Box Thursday, Arts and Crafts and LifeSkills!

In 2024, the MYC after-school program consisted of **48** different programs, totaling **1,938** program hours.



Each year, we end our After-school program with a party for the registered after-school members! This year's end of the year party was a remarkable success with 101 in attendance! We had many of our traditional specials such as Scholarship Presentation, a photo booth, indoor jumpy, lawn games, face painting, snow cones, senior staff gifts and awards, superlatives and our awesome water slide, Jumpy!

MYC SUMMER CAMP

The MYC offers an affordable, six-week summer camp every year. Activities include weekly field

trips and fun in-town activities. We had 120 families participate this summer! The camp includes fun weekly themes that we pair with different activities, crafts and field trips!

The campers also enjoyed Fino Pool twice a week,

Each week the campers participate in a group craft project, enjoy free-play in the gym, game

MYC Volunteers

With the help of over 193 volunteers in 2024, volunteering over 1,588 hours, the MYC has been able to successfully accomplish many events, programs, collections of donations, fundraisers, and more! We are so proud that over 55% of all our after-school programs are offered by either volunteers or outside services from our community partners! In addition to volunteering to



run programs, some other volunteer efforts include dedicating time to

participating in our monthly Board Meetings, Annual Golf Tournament Fundraiser and/or Committee, CraftRoots Fundraiser, March Madness tournament, serving our annual Thanksgiving

meal for our after-school members, packing meals for our summer camp, after school program and/ or

weekend bags from Spoonful's and preparing raffle baskets for our events! To help put their impact into perspective, the hours volunteered are equivalent to over \$51,000 in staffing expenses saved, according to the Independent Sector! Without volunteers, we would not be able to achieve all the things we have and plan to do in the future so, THANK YOU!





Additional Food Programs



We work with our community partners and strive to best serve our members by offering supplemental food programs. We are pleased to partner with Spoonful's, to provide weekend groceries for families in need and with the Hockomock Area YMCA to offer a monthly Mobile Food Pantry. This year, we distributed 3,250 lbs. of rescued food and 368 bags of groceries through these collaborations! Beginning in October 2024, our amazing collaboration with Seven Hills Aspire of Hopedale began. This is a day program that supports adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities. Together we were able to schedule some members of their program to come to the Center weekly. Together with their staff, they divide up the weekly groceries received from Spoonfuls for members who are registered for this service.

MYC RENTALS AND ADDITIONAL PROGRAMS

The MYC is available for rental purposes year-round, which helps sustain our 10-month free after school program and staffing costs. This year, the Center received over \$44,000 of rental revenue to support our programs. The rooms we have available to rent are the gymnasium and/or stage area, conference room, dance/fitness room, boxing room/gym and batting cages. The Center is also looking forward to the completion of our future multi-purpose media center, to add additional programs and rental space, anticipated in 2025.

Kids Play

Senior Walking



Throughout the year the Center opens our gym, at no cost, during morning hours, for Milford Senior Residents to use the gym for walking. This provides them a safe place to get

their steps in while also giving them the opportunity to connect with each other and





enjoy a cup of coffee and/or tea! During 2024, we had **24** seniors use our facility!






Grants: The MYC was awarded over \$45,000 worth of state funding and grants from the following: Rockland Trust Charitable Foundation, The Fidelity Charitable Donor-Advised Fund Grant and the Commonwealth Corporation under the Commonwealth of Massachusetts YouthWorks Program and MassHire Central Career Center.



YouthWorks: It is so awesome to see the YouthWorks program up and running for the third year in a row! The Youth Center received a \$40,000 contract from the State to run an income-eligible summer employment program. This program is supported by the Commonwealth Corporation under the Commonwealth of Massachusetts YouthWorks Program and MassHire Central Career Center. Through this program, the Center oversaw 12 youth employees at 4 worksites, including: Milford Youth Center, Nutriforia Nutrition,

Double Bubble Laundromat, and We All Hoop, allowing additional help at each location at no cost to their individual departments and/or businesses. We would also like to thank all of the presenters who came in over the summer!

Scholarships: Every year, we award Milford graduating seniors' scholarships/grants, as a part of our End of the Year Party for the afterschool program! We include this as part of the event, so after school members can see that they can one day apply for our scholarships/grant opportunities!


